## 2. Progress

The Centre for Urban Studies (CUS) is one of the largest academic programs of its kind in the world, aimed at advancing understanding and knowledge of cities and urbanization, and at informing urban policies and planning. The Centre maintains research networks and collaborative projects with leading institutions around the world. In the Netherlands, the Centre has close ties with the City of Amsterdam and with the PBL. Within the University, the Centre facilitates interdisciplinary urban research and supports interdisciplinary teaching. In 2013, the Centre complemented its niche in comparative urban research with a new strategic focus on questions of urban sustainability, which it intends to strengthen in the years ahead.

### *2013 Highlights*

- The total affiliated research staff has in 2013 expanded to 52 tenured/non-tenured personnel and more than 60 PhD students;
- Overall active external research funding in 2013 reached a record 21,4 million euro with funds acquired during the year amounting to 5,1 million;
- Urban Studies research staff in 2013 produced more than 100 refereed journal articles plus more than 150 other publications;
- Three CUS-recruited young talents obtained tenure in FMG;
- CUS financed the hiring of two new young talents;
- Outstanding event of the year: CUS organized a major International Symposium in October of 2013 on 'Amsterdam's Canal District in Global Perspective. Past and Present', along with VU University, the City of Amsterdam, Stadsherstel and the Stichting Amsterdam Monumentenstad;
- In December 2013, CUS was named an 'Innovating Research Centre' by the UN's Global Compact Cities Programme for its outstanding work on questions of urban development and sustainability;
- CUS sponsored two summer schools (PhD and BA levels) in 2013.

### 2.1 Growth and Strengthening

This was a year of growth in terms of numbers of staff, external funding, and productivity. The growth was partly related to the ongoing successful recruitment of young talent and their acquisition of external funding. Another part of it is the increasing quality of affiliated faculty over time. The reputation of the Centre continues to manifest itself in the attraction of talent from other universities in the Netherlands. This year, Justus Uitermark joined us from the Erasmus University; he followed in the footsteps of Rivke Jaffe, who came from Leiden the previous year. Both have already contributed to major acquisition. Within the university, we were joined by some key senior players who play an important part in our new strategic direction of urban sustainable development: Joyeeta Gupta and Peter Sloot.

We have strengthened our institutional network with a host of academic partners and particularly our ties with the City of Amsterdam, (DRO and BMA, B&W), with the VU, with PBL, with a range of non-governmental agencies in Amsterdam. The Canal District Symposium was an important event in this regard as it brought together local institutions of higher education, government and other public institutions, and private entities, under the auspices of CUS. Most significantly, we built close relation with the United National Global Compact Cities Program

that named us an “Innovating Research Center” in December of 2013 (see: <http://citiesprogramme.com/aboutus/innovating-centres>).

Our identity within the faculty and the University is getting stronger. In part this owes to new 2013 initiatives such as the CUS Working Paper Series that helps to rapidly disseminate new research and that serves as a forum for exchange among research staff; another new initiative are the ‘Republiek Amsterdam’ (invitation only) debates with one or more aldermen of the city that are held several times per year in the Academische Club. Recurring events are important as well, such as the Annual Urban China Workshop (we just had the third) or the Urban Movies with Pakhuis de Zwijger.

The year 2013 saw another important initiative that helped to fuel innovation and strategic redirection. Besides the CUS Advisory Board, regular meetings have been held with a small group of young, recently tenured, key research personnel that is officially the Editorial Board of the Working Paper Series. This group of successful assistant and associate professors adds a dynamic to the Centre and an opportunity for out-of-the-box thinking with regards to the future of the Centre. The group played an important part in the new strategic emphasis on urban sustainable development.

## 2.2 A New Strategic Direction: Urban Sustainable Development

The future of cities around the world depends on our ability to plan sustainable urban environments, materially and socially. One of the signposts of this growing awareness is the re-labeling of the United Nations Millennium Development Goals (2000) to *Sustainable Development Goals* (soon to be adopted, in 2015) with a heavy emphasis on cities. This “New Age of Sustainable Development” (Jeffrey Sachs) will place a premium on innovative interdisciplinary research across social sciences, natural sciences, humanities, and computational sciences.

Urban Studies at UvA has thus far been particularly strong in the social sciences and planning with a considerable part of ongoing research focused on questions of social sustainability (e.g., integration-segregation, class/spatial polarization, governance, transportation, etc.). It is important to expand the scope of research to include questions of environmental sustainability pertaining to the physical milieu (e.g., water, air, pollution, urban ‘metabolism’ etc.) and to integrate these questions in a single urban sustainability agenda with interdisciplinary beta-gamma links.

The social science emphasis will remain but we should be in a better position to link up with research on the physical urban environment and on the social (urban) context of technological policy interventions – within our university, nationally, and internationally. It is an important strategic adjustment that should, among other things, make us even more competitive in the world of research funding. Note that two of our staff members (Musterd and Gupta) were recently invited by NWO to join a select panel with representation from NWO, ESRC (UK) and FAPESP (Brazil) in Sao Paulo in February of 2014 to discuss international calls for proposals on the theme of urban sustainable development (each of the three countries had 10 representatives).

The recognition of CUS as a *Innovating Research Centre* by the *Global Compact Cities Programme* of the United Nations, which propagates sustainable urban development and policies, reflects the Centre’s existing stature in the fields of planning, governance, transportation, housing, and other questions of social sustainability. We are currently in advanced high-level talks with the City of Amsterdam, for it to become a signatory of this UN program as well (Gehrels and Van Poelgeest

have verbally committed and this should be finalized in the next few weeks). This can foster a new strategic partnership of the UvA and the City in the realm of sustainable urban development.

## 2.3 Challenges

The challenges cited in last year's report concern the risk of 'overstretch', the lack of common office space, and the difficulty of forging a common identity in an institutional environment with competing affiliations. As indicated above, we believe we have made good progress in creating an urban studies community across the faculty and the various research program groups. The problem of the lack of common space will hopefully largely be resolved later this year when we all move to the new REC. Finally, the challenge of overstretch in the public domain (outreach) is not one that will go away any time soon because there are lots of 'temptations' to get involved with a host of things 'urban' and lots of organizations. But we have become more disciplined in this regard and more comfortable sticking with our main mission of pure research, valorisation, and bridging research and education.

The main challenge at this moment lies with the scarcity of funds, especially in view of our intent to reorient towards a more comprehensive research agenda on urban sustainable development.

## 4. Other Results

### 4.1 Talent Recruiting

In 2013, the Centre recruited 2 assistant professors with highly regarded and competitive credentials (Boterman, Van Acker). The recruitments are strategic positions in Urban Studies at the interface of existing disciplines or programme groups (e.g., planning/development studies, or sociology/political science). These assistant professors are appointed for 2 years and have a 70% research position. If they show significant output and manage to obtain major external funding, they will be considered for a steady appointment. This has proven a successful formula in the past years as we were able to recruit top talent and add them to the ranks of our faculty: Richard Ronald, Rivke Jaffe, Darshan Vigneswaran, and Wouter van Gent among them. We have high hopes that Boterman and Van Acker, too, will be successful.

### 4.2 Research Exposure

In 2013, we helped increase the visibility of urban studies through the promotion of research projects and related events not only among our research staff but also in UvA newsletters, media, on posters and on the web. We maintain contact with key persons of the Amsterdam Economic Board, Planbureau voor de Leefomgeving, Dienst Ruimtelijke Ordening – gemeente Amsterdam, Bureau Monumentenzorg en Archeologie, Bureau Onderzoek & Statistiek Amsterdam, Pakhuis de Zwijger, Arcam, Stadsherstel, VU University, Kenniskring and Sarpathi to promote our events within their organization.

The exposure of Urban Studies at the UvA has also increased with our improved and now highly maintained website ([www.urbanstudies.uva.nl](http://www.urbanstudies.uva.nl)). In 2013, the Urban Studies Blog was introduced on our website, which highly increased the average number of visitors. In total, the number of visitors to the website has increased from 11,000 unique visitors in 2012, to 18,266 unique visitors in 2013. Visitors came from all over the world but the main contributing countries to these visitor statistics are the Netherlands (9,242), the United States (1,422), the United Kingdom (1,322), Germany (720), India (602) and China (589), which implies that 50 percent of the visitors originated from abroad. The website, thus, contributes highly to the international character of CUS.

### 4.3 Events

The Centre for Urban Studies focuses on the interdisciplinary study of urban phenomena and urban processes and aims to develop synergies that allow innovative and cutting edge-research ventures and curricula. Through the launch of the CUS Working Paper Series and the co-organization of international workshops Urban Studies has promoted interdisciplinary and international comparative research as well as contributed to the wide dissemination of research output and expertise in the field. The Centre has also funded selected projects among research



staff that are interdisciplinary, that are dependent on funding (i.e., are not likely to happen without our funding) and that have an identifiable end product.
